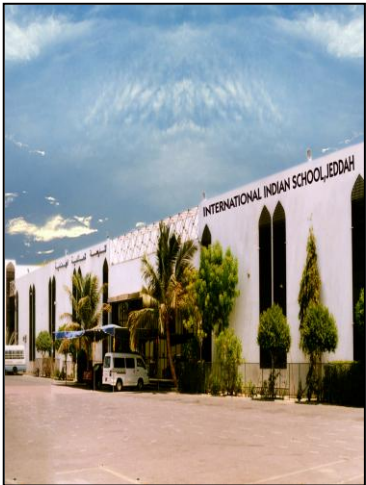


About the School

The International Indian School, Jeddah formerly known as the Embassy of India School, was founded in 1969. It made a very humble beginning with a limited number of students, staff and infrastructural facilities in a makeshift area. The objective of establishing the school was to impart quality education to the children of Indian nationals residing in Jeddah. The construction of the present Girls' Section started in 1982 with the foundation stone laid by the Late Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi and was completed in 1984. The section located in Al-Aziziah Dist. spreads over an area of more than 8000 sq. meters and has all the required facilities.

By the late 1980s, the students' strength had unexpectedly increased to the extent that the vast premises of the school in Al-Aziziah were not sufficient. Hence, the construction of an additional premises - the present Boys' Section - was started in 1992 and completed in 1994. The Boys' Section in Al-Rehab Dist. spreads over an area of more than 17000 sq. meters with a big playground and all other facilities. With the blessings of the Almighty and constant efforts put in by well wishers, the school has expanded in a phenomenal manner. Currently the school is catering to the educational needs of over 10000 students.

Increase in the demand for admissions and paucity of space in the existing buildings paved way for locating a new premise in 2010. The new premise is located in Nadi Al-Ahli Street, Al- Rehab Dist. The Kindergarten Section and I & II Block Girls Section function in two separate buildings which also has a spacious play area.



Primary Section

Curriculum

The school is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi and prepares the students for All India Secondary School Examination (Std. X) and All India Senior School Certificate Examination (Std. XII). The medium of instruction is English.

I. Kindergarten Classes

The children are taught spoken English, Numerals and Arabic. Talents in the fields of Art, Craft, Music, Singing and Dramatics are developed. To improve the psychomotor domain, children are exposed to various activities such as plasticine moulding, paper folding, fitting blocks to insets etc. The foundation for good handwriting is laid here. The child is exposed to the experience of interacting in a peer group.

II. Primary and Secondary Level

These sections help the children to develop their all-round personality. In the classroom, the child is encouraged to understand rather than to memorize, to enjoy learning, to think independently and logically and to develop good study habits. The subjects taught include English, Hindi, Arabic, Urdu, Malayalam, Tamil, Telugu, Mathematics, Environmental Science, Science, Social Science, Computer Science, Physical Education, Art and Craft, Work Experience, Saudi Arabian Culture, Islamic Studies, Moral Science, Art of Healthy and Productive Living, Disaster Management, etc.

III. Senior Secondary Level

At this level, students are prepared for higher learning. Here the emphasis is laid on providing a strong foundation in subjects such as English, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Computer Science, Economics, Business Studies, Accountancy, History, Geography, Informatics Practice, Physical Education, Home Science, Multimedia & Web. Technology, Environmental Education, Entrepreneurship, Urdu and Arabic based on the group opted by the students.

Co-curricular Activities



Besides academics, students have facilities for adequate exposure to co-curricular activities like Literary and Cultural Club, Music, Documentaries, Dramatics, Art, Calligraphy, Sewing, Cooking, Model-Making, Gymnastics, Athletics, Cricket, Chess, Badminton, Football, Carroms, Table Tennis, Volleyball, Basketball, Swimming etc.



Students are divided into four houses. Red, Blue, Green and Yellow. This system inculcates in the students the spirit of friendly competition, the urge to excel and sportsmanship qualities.

The school offers ample opportunities for students to develop a sound body which is essential for a sound mind. Various Inter-house and Inter school competitions are conducted periodically.



Inter House Competitions in Sports and Co-curricular events are organized periodically. Selected students are trained to compete in Inter School Sports Meet and League Tournaments. The School has been a regular winner of CBSE Cluster Championship and bears laudable record in cricket and football leagues.

Facilities & Provisions

Library

There are well stocked libraries with book lending facilities for students. Newspapers, magazines and journals on current affairs, science, sports and education are subscribed.



Science Laboratories

Well-equipped laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Home Science, Geography, Mathematics and Computer Science offer the students avenues for experimentation and learning through practice.



Activity Room

A well equipped, activity room in KG and the Lower Primary Section, with a variety of teaching aids, puzzles, activities and entertainment helps in the development of psychomotor domain of the children.





Career Guidance Cell

To provide latest information on courses offered in various institutions of higher learning in India and in other countries, the Career Guidance Cell provides all assistance to the students to choose the right course for their future career. Seminars, contact programmes and conventions are organized to apprise the students of the admission procedures in institutes of higher learning.



Canteen

Canteen facility providing nutritious and hygienic eatable and soft drinks is available to the students of both the sections.



First Aid

There are medical rooms with First Aid facility, under the charge of qualified nurses to attend to the medical needs of the students.

Personal Accident Insurance Coverage

All students are provided personal Accident Insurance Coverage against the payment of SR. 15/- as the annual premium payment per student.

Admission

1. Admission is restricted to children of Indian Nationals only. Admission to students of other nationalities may be considered only with prior permission from the Ministry of Education, KSA.
2. Registration for admission will be done on payment of SR. 50.00. A copy of Iqama, (with the name of the student entered) copies of passports of the student and both the parents should be attached. For classes VI & above Transfer Certificate and statement of marks of the previous class duly attested by Regional Educational Authorities must be attached.
3. Admission is offered on the basis of priority of registration, performance of the candidate in the admission test and in the light of the criteria laid down by the school. The test / interview is conducted according to the schedule given at the time of registration. Generally the admission tests are conducted on Thursdays.
4. Admission will not be granted after April 30 except for students coming from recognised schools within 30 days of issuance of T.C. as per the availability of seats.
5. A student coming from CBSE/ Other Boards is required to appear for a test. On qualifying the test he /she will be admitted on submission of the School Leaving Certificate and Report card duly attested by authorised District / Regional Educational Authorities.
6. Documents in original (passport and Iqama) authenticating the residential status of the pupil and the parents in KSA must be produced at the time of registration. **Latest photocopies of passport and Iqama must be submitted as and when they are renewed.**
7. Student's name and date of birth shall be entered in the Scholar Register in words and figures on the basis of entries in the School Leaving Certificate / Passport. No alteration in the name or date of birth or other entries in the Scholar Register will be permitted after the student is formally admitted.
8. Admission to classes IX-XII will be done strictly according to CBSE rules. Students who do not fulfil the attendance criteria for the academic year, will not be admitted in any case.
9. Students seeking admission to class IX & XI must submit the Board registration form along with the prescribed fee.
10. Students seeking admission in different streams in class XI will be considered as per the availability of seats and the minimum qualifying criteria set by the school.

- Annual Personal accident insurance premium of SR.15/-, payable along with the fees for the first month of the academic year or at the time of admission.

If any parent pays the total fee of his child for all the 12 months together in advance for the whole academic year from 01 April to 31 March, then a discount of 7.5% will be given on the tuition fee only. If any parent pays the fee for half the academic year in advance from April 01 to September 30 or October 01 to March 31 then a discount of 5% will be given on tuition fee only. All other fees except tuition fee will have to be paid in full.

Fee Payment Schedule

1. All fees are payable on or before the last day of every calendar month.
2. The fee for the month of March should be paid along with the fee for February. All fees payable for the complete academic year for students of KG to VIII, IX&XI should be paid before the declaration of the annual exam result. Board going students (X&XII) should pay the fee for February and March before collecting their hall tickets.
3. Late fee will be charged at the rate of SR.1/- for every day of default (for each child whose fee is not paid) after the last day of every month. Default payment for every completed month will be SR. 30/-. After the maximum default of 2 months the student's name will be struck off the rolls.
4. Tuition fee will be charged from the beginning of session for the whole academic year. If any part of the fee has been paid in any of the CBSE affiliated schools / equivalently recognized school that part of fees may be condoned on production of authentic documents duly countersigned by the Regional Educational Department authorities and the fee in such cases may be charged from the date of admission / the date of last payment in the former school, whichever is earlier. If however, the TC from the school is not countersigned by the Education Department authorities then the fee has to be paid from the beginning of the session.
5. Concession of School fee for (Indian nationals only):
First and Second child in the family will be charged full tuition fee. There will be a concession of 30% from third child onwards. The fee is charged as per the level (position in the family) of the student, which changes automatically as and when any student from the family leaves the school.

Transport

The school transport facility is available on selected routes. Application for this facility can be submitted in the prescribed form with the required details to the Transport Department. This facility is subject to the availability of seat in the bus opted for. Buses will ply through their regular routes and this will not be changed according to individual needs.

2. Resumption after discontinuation of bus service, the following will apply:

Less than four months, arrears of four months bus fee will be applicable. More than four months, non refundable bus service charges as above will be applicable.

Rules for Bus Users

1. Providing bus facility is not mandatory on the part of the school. The bus facility is provided as a convenience. All possible care is taken to make the bus facility safe for the student. However, the school will not be responsible for any unforeseen incident.
2. Buses will ply in accordance with the existing routes chalked out by the school.
3. It is compulsory that the students wear identification badges specified for their routes. Students should be present at the respective stops at the pickup time.
4. Students should board their buses immediately after the school is over.
5. Unruly and unbecoming behaviour in the bus will lead to disciplinary action including withdrawal of bus facility.
6. Students are not allowed to board a bus other than the one allotted to them.
7. Parents are requested to inform the school authorities in writing if and when they bring / take home their bus-using-children to / from the school.
8. Students will be accommodated as per the carrying capacity of buses.
9. Children will be dropped at specified points and not at the door step.
- 10. Fee defaulters will not be allowed to use the bus facility.**
11. Discontinuation of school bus service by the student should be informed a month in advance.
12. Resumption after discontinuation of bus service, the following will apply:
Less than four months, arrears of four months bus fee will be applicable. More than four months, non refundable bus service charges as above will be applicable.
13. While considering the request for a change of location / route, bus facility will be provided subject to availability of space in the bus.
